Former FPC Church Administrator Butch Gerfers, a descendent of John Coker's brother Joseph, gave the presentation and shared some interesting stories and little known facts about Coker Community and the Texas Historical Marker that the cemetery received in 2010. After the meeting, several stayed for a short point-and-talk walk-through tour of the cemetery.
